She understands working with migrant and Indigenous church communities can be both painful and joyful, but the result is an enriched church, and advocates listening to voices that might have been silent in the past, to inspire and encourage the church.

Ross Coburn's work with the Northern Synod



Ross Coburn with General Secretary, Rev Janet Staines Ross Coburn, Executive Officer, explains:

"I was approached in May 2023 to assist with the rebuilding of the Northern Synod after Synod Standing Committee had determined that assistance was required and UCA Queensland had offered to provide such support. My role was to be on the ground and be the conduit between the two Synods. It was evident early that the team was lacking, and certainly looking for, guidance and leadership to assist them through some very difficult times. Cashflow was terrible, the accounts were in a mess with no apparent solution in site, there was poor communication between all areas of the Synod and certainly a lack of trust by some with the decision makers.

"We worked through it, got the people reengaged, defined roles, identified areas of lack of

knowledge and set about to come up with a good structure and plan to return Northern Synod to a body that could concentrate on what was their core (Ministry and the faith) by removing the other barriers. The first 3 months flew (the period of my contract) but it was evident that more was required and I agreed to return post my leave to continue the task.

"Upon my return addition expert staffing was in place and I was asked to change focus and concentrate on removing the Synod's debt through the assessment of what was the best use of the property assets and to dispose of any excess assets. Fortunately, with the support of the Synod decision makers, supporting difficult decisions at times, we have been able to achieve this goal. By the end of September 2024, the Northern Synod will be debt free and working hard on operating within a balanced budget and positive cashflow.

"We have come a long way on this difficult-attimes journey, but I say with much confidence, THE NORTHERN


